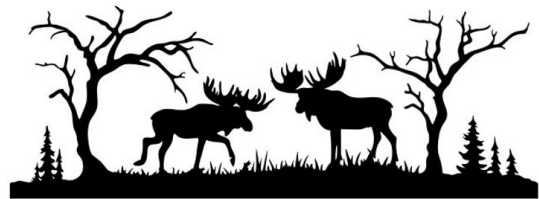
MOOSE of the Month BRET BOIVIN

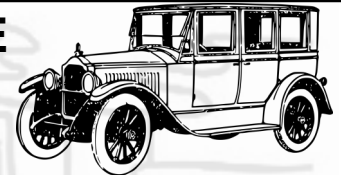

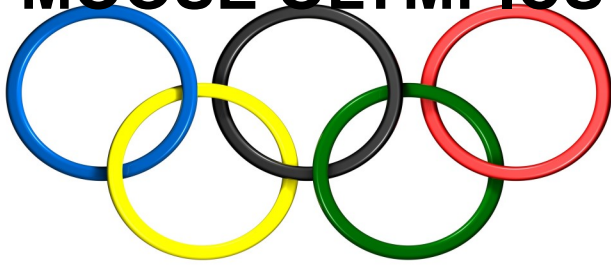

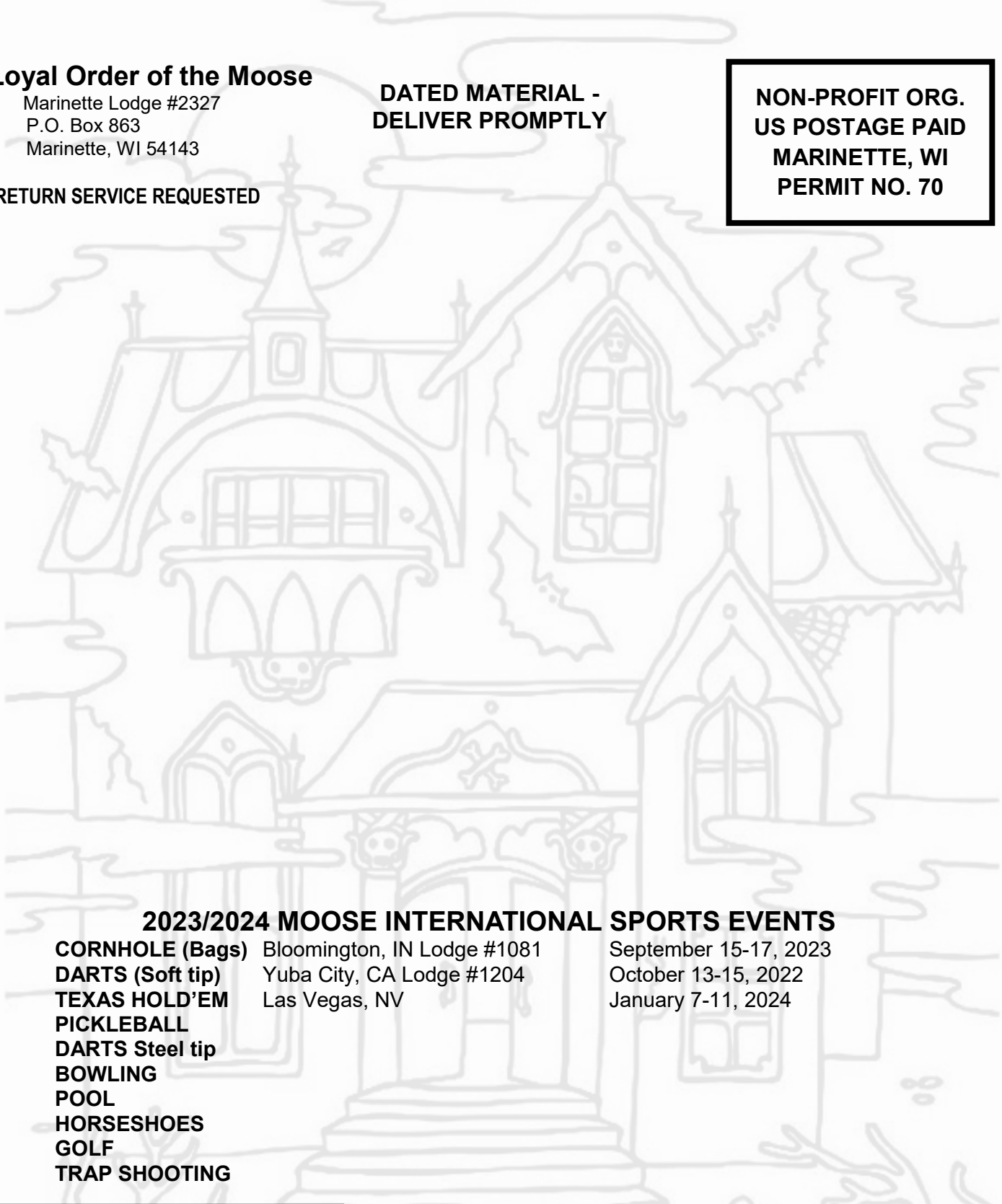
