

Senior ID Event

Please join us Saturday May 19th from 10:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. This event will be held during the Senior Expo at the Pine Tree Mall. Pre-register by calling the ADRC at 715-7342-3850. This is your opportunity to receive free documentation that has your picture, fingerprints and a video clip of yourself or a loved one. This information could be lifesaving in a case where the Senior may become missing. This is especially important for those suffering from Alzheimer's and other Dementia. Call 715-732-3850 to schedule an appointment and complete a caregiver application. ADRC staff will be available to share additional Alzheimer's and other Dementia information and resources.

Highway Cleanup

Chain Reaction Day

This means citizens helping adults in their neighborhood. Elderly Services sends a list of elderly people who need their yard work and other things done outside that they can no longer do. This will be on Saturday April 28th approx. 9:00 a.m.

Scholarship Program

There is no better way to help the youth of the Fraternity than to offer them the opportunity to further their education, and that is exactly what the Moose "Heart of the Community" Scholarship is all about. The following requirements must be met in order to be eligible for the program: the applicant must be a student of the high school graduating class of 2019 (to be verified by a high school official), have a mother, father, step-parent, grand parent or legal guardian who is a current member of the Moose in good standing, have a cumulative grade point average (gpa) of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale or equivalent (proof must be provided via a copy of high school transcript or most recent report card. The applicant must also have participated in In-School/Extra-Curricular activities (i.e. school sports teams, band, chess club, theater, etc.) To satisfy this requirement a school official must verify this by completing their section of the application. Out-of-School activities (i.e. employment, scouting programs, music lessons, non-school related sports.) To satisfy this requirement Moose International must receive a letter or email from the student's supervising adult (boss, troop leader, etc.) no later than June 30, 2018. The letter should include the name, title, email and the phone number of the supervising adult, details of the student's participation, the type of activities they engage in and the dates/date range of their participation. They must volunteer on behalf of a fraternal unit of the Moose (to be verified by the lodge Administrator, Chapter Recorder or Moose Legion Secretary on the application or by email, fax or U.S. mail.) If any of these requirements are NOT met the applicant will NOT be eligible for any drawing. The application can be found in the members area of www.mooseintl.org. Click on the "Heart of the Community" link located on the far left of the page, then click on the Moose "Heart of the Community" Scholarship program.


