Do you know what the guest requirements of Moose International are, as required by the Internal Revenue Service? Marinette Moose Lodge is required to follow these regulations if we want to remain a Moose Lodge.

1. When you invite a guest into our lodge, your guest is not allowed to spend any money in the lodge. You, the member, must pay for your guests drinks and food.

2. You must sign in your guest in the guest book located near the entrance to our lodge.

3. You are allowed to invite your guest into our lodge only twice. If your guest wishes to come to our lodge again, they must fill out an application and become a member.

4. Your guest can not come into our lodge without you, the member present, and they must leave when you leave.


