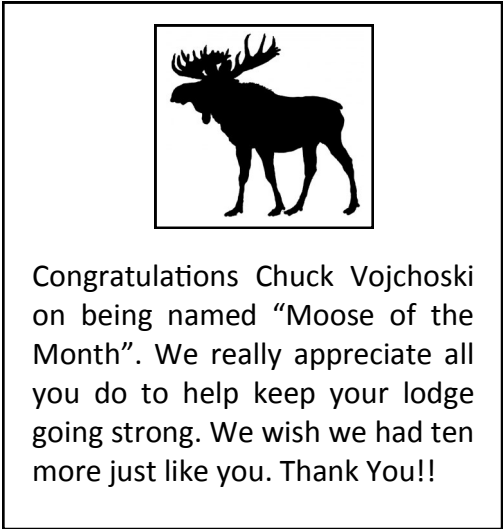

### Attention: High School Scholarship Opportunity

October started our two month cycle of youth awareness congresses throughout the state of WI. The youth awareness Program is a scholarship program that awards \$30,000 in college scholarship money annually, that is open to all students in grades 9—12. ( That means they need no Moose affiliation )

#### What do the students need to do:

The students and parents must attend a 30 minute meeting ( during Sept.– Nov. ), to outline the program.

Must complete 3 kids talks with kids talks reports to 4—9 year olds on a topic of their choosing by Feb. 29th.

Kids reports are then judged by a group of 9th—12th graders ( no adults involved ). The selected winner receives an all expense paid trip to International Student Congress in April 25th—29th 2019 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Where there will be five scholarships awarded at the International Student Congress—\$12,000, \$8,000, \$5,000, \$3,000, and \$2,000. Wisconsin Moose Association Youth Awareness Program will offer scholarships for the top two as well as runners up based on program participation.

#### What do we need from you:

We need help getting the word out ( brochures available at the Lodge ). Tell your family, friends, neighbors tell everyone you know about this amazing opportunity. We are looking for members who would like to be on the Youth Awareness committee to assist in planning and mentoring.

#### Why this is important:

Provides teenagers the opportunity to be a positive influence in the lives of younger children. Teaches teenagers the importance of community service. Provides instruction to our younger generation being delivered in a way they will truly embrace.

Last year our very own Nate Plym was the third place winner at the International Congress. Over Nate's 4 years he earned approximately \$14,000 in scholarships. 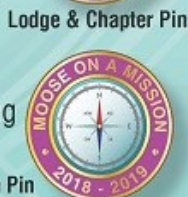
